The Board, at my urging, has voted to increase our scholarship to \$2,000 to a MSU fisheries student. We hope to have the recipient available for a presentation at the banquet. My thinking was that the cost of everything, including education, has risen and we have been blessed with a little extra money this year. This is an effort to move in the direction we were going a few years ago when we were sponsoring a lot of community projects and legal activities.

Also, continuing with more emphasis on youth I have attended a planning meeting for the Dr. Earl fishing program introduced to us by John Hesse. They are looking for more volunteers from our group and they are also interested in trying to provide a program in June with the emphasis on fly fishing. It may be possible that we could combine this activity with a June meeting at Hawk Island Park. One of our members suggested to me that a June meeting for casting practice might be a good thing. In conjunction with this same group the board has voted to pay \$250 to help sponsor the new fishing map for this area. Our logo and information will be placed on the map. These maps will be given out free at various places like the licensing area at Meijer.

This year will be a trial run and next year it is anticipat-

ed that 10,000 maps will be produced and I am sure a larger donation will be appreciated.

John Ross has once again agreed to coordinate our work project, which is tentatively scheduled for May 18th. If you have not participated in the past, I highly recommend showing up. Besides being helpful, it is interesting to see how the projects work. This year may also be different, in that, if there is enough work and John can figure out a way with our federal partners, we may have as our guests the Grand River Fly Tiers. Apparently they have heard about our projects and want to help.

Finally, it is getting to be that time of year again. We need some nominees for officers and we have been thinking about changing the by-laws to help some of you take on responsibility. As you may, or may not know, we do not have a President Elect at this time. Several people have mentioned that they do not want to be the President because it is a three year commitment. So, we are looking at making some changes that would lower the commitment time. We are also looking at making some of the other positions, such as Newsletter Editor, voting positions. This would allow us a greater opportunity to conduct business if another board member could not



Just posting this information again as a reminder for those that didn't make last months meeting.


